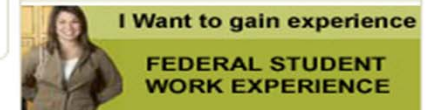

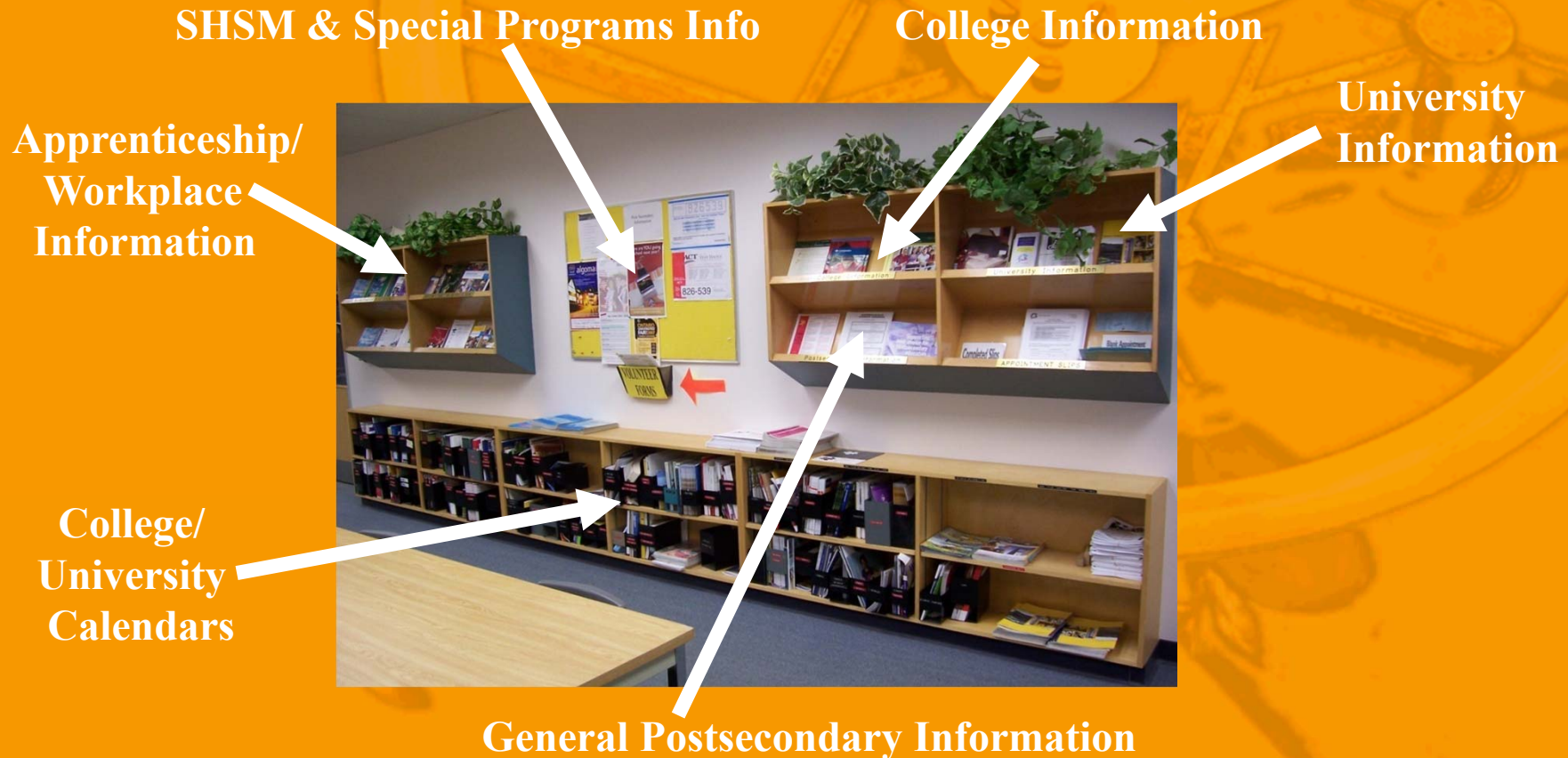

Fundamental Skills Communicating in written form, orally, problem solving, using numbers, information management

Personal Management Skills Positive attitude & behaviours, responsibility, adaptability, goal setting, time management, continuous learning, working safely

Teamwork Skills Working effectively with others to accomplish a task

Entering an Apprenticeship:



Apprenticeship is a hands-on training program for people who want to work in one of the four skill sectors:

- **Construction**
- **Manufacturing/Industrial**
- **Auto Service/Motive Power**
- **Service**

90% of learning is provided in the workplace by the employer

10% takes place in a classroom where an apprentice receives instruction on theory (*which is becoming highly technical*).

Five Steps to Becoming a Skilled Tradesperson



1: RESEARCH

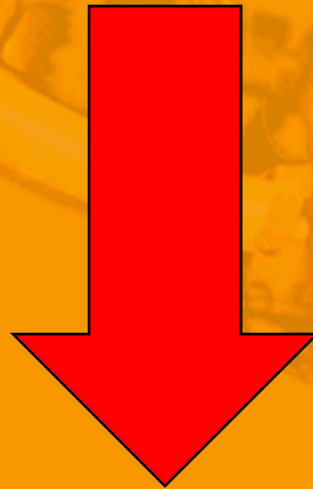
